

HARVEST-TIME

For the past sixteen months, singing in our churches and Cathedrals has not been permitted unless those singing have been members of a small professional choir. For our Sunday and weekday services, as well as occasions of baptisms, weddings and funerals this has left something of a void in our worship and liturgy. Yet it must be stated that given the suffering of so many during the Pandemic crisis, not being able to sing in a church is a very small price to pay if it has helped to decrease the risk of spreading the virus.

Our Benefice churches are Blessed in having accomplished organists who have regularly provided music, even if not accompanied by the hymn singing. By the time this article is read it will more than likely be the case that the restrictions within our churches will have been lifted to once again allow our congregations to sing; just in time for our Harvest Festivals.

One of our popular and traditional Harvest hymns is strangely one that began life more associated with the Armed Forces, becoming both a hymn for funerals and Remembrance Sunday; 'Eternal Father Strong To Save.'

It was written in 1860 by William Whiting, Headmaster of the Winchester College Choristers' School. Whiting had been approached by a young student who was fearful of a forthcoming ocean journey he was soon to undertake to the United States. Whiting, a practising Christian, wrote the hymn for his student to 'anchor his faith.' It is said that the inspiration for the words came from Psalm 107, which describes the power of the seas in great detail, the fear amongst sailors and God's deliverance from danger;

'Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, and He brought them out of their distress.'

In the late 19th century the hymn was adopted by the Royal Navy and the United States Navy, and since then has been adapted by other Services including the Royal Marines and the United States Marine Corps. It is regularly sung at 'church services' aboard ships at sea.

A popular hymn at the funerals of American Presidents, being sung, at amongst others, the funerals of John F. Kennedy, Franklin D. Roosevelt and Richard Nixon. More recently the hymn was sung at the funeral of Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, at St George's Chapel Windsor Castle; in recognition of his service to the Royal Navy from 1939 – 1952. It is always included at Remembrance Day and Remembrance Sunday services.

In the late 1960s it began to gain popularity at church Harvest Festival services. This was in recognition of the work of Merchant Seamen and women, plying their trade upon the seas and oceans of the world, through among other things, transport and fishing; the 'Harvest of the Seas.'

Today the hymn is now used widely throughout our services, and will once again be sung this year in our Cathedrals and churches as we celebrate God's Harvest.

The rain in May followed by the warmth of June has led to the most prolific growth on the allotments – potatoes have shot up and out and reached flowering now, a promise of a large harvest to come. Each growing year is different thanks to our variable weather and each year there are successes and failures amongst the crops I try to grow.

Strawberries have been a success – with a bumper harvest. It is important to cover the crop as the fruit ripens as birds love to take the fruit – squirrels too but I haven't seen them at the allotments.

The chickens are right next to the strawberry patch and when I am picking I throw a few over the fence to the chickens - they catch them before they fall! Pots of jam have been made and a tub of ice-cream. Other fruit looks promising too — blackcurrants and summer raspberries ready now in July and red currants to come.

Broad beans finally pushed on and flowered well in June but the harvest felt small this year. There has been rumours that the rats are taking the broad beans (evidence of pods chewed up and removed!) No one can work out where the rats are living as no runs can be seen. Frustrating for us when we wait months for the harvest.

The little annual flower I use as a kind of green manure cover crop - Poached egg plant - grew so tall and lasted too long this year — I like to leave it for the bees and other pollinating insects — it covers the ground I am not ready to plant up and then once it has flowered I can clear it away easily. BUT not this year! I think the late start to growth due to the low temperatures in April meant it was still in flower when I wanted to clear it away. Lesson learnt to be more disciplined and leave smaller strips of the flower. The consequence of this, is I planted out my leeks and pumpkin plants at the end of June — not the beginning as I would have liked. They are settling in now but may not grow as big.

The purple kale and cauliflowers are growing under the shelter of netting – another crop essential to protect from pigeons and cabbage white butterflies. My experiment of leaving some kale uncovered but planting Cosmos and

leaving self-sown Teasel amongst it has worked in some ways - the kale is still there – but the Teasel is so large it has dominated the other plants around it.

Sweet corn is doing well – timing is important for this crop – it need as many days of sunshine that summer can offer to reach maturity. I managed to get this in at Whitsun half term break so there should be enough time ahead for a good crop.

Another success has been sweet peas. I save seed each year. I grow in the small poly tunnel autumn sown plants — they actually self-sowed themselves - then I sow in some seed in pots to plant out in spring for outside growing. Both methods have worked well with early flowers from the poly tunnel plants and the outside sweet peas are still in full flower. They may not last for the Horticultural show in August though so will remember to sow another batch in April next year!

Red spider mite – a tiny spider like creature is making itself known in the poly tunnel – it attacks French beans and cucumbers leaving the plant yellow and with a fine webbing. Each year it appears when condition are too hot and dry. I have tried damping down the soil and regular misting the plants but this year I have sent off for a biological control parasitic wasp which is supposed to help. I will report back on this next time.

NINE WAYS TO BUILD A WILDLIFE FRIENDLY GARDEN

1. Let the grass grow

Leave your mower in the shed. Long grass is one of the rarest garden habitats. By letting some or all of your lawn grow you will make space for many plant and insect species, including butterflies and wildflowers. Mowing the lawn only once every four weeks gives 'short-grass' plants like daisies and white clover a chance to flower in profusion, boosting nectar production tenfold.

2. Bird box and feeding

Birds are an important part your garden's ecosystem, and creating bird boxes and putting out food will help them thrive. Put your bird box up high in a sheltered area. In spring, provide protein-rich feed, such as fat balls. Seeds are best in the winter. If there are cats nearby place your feeder near a dense bush to provide birds with cover.

3. Grow climbers

Ivy is a very useful plant for wildlife. Both the flowers and seeds are good sources of food and pollen. Plus, it provides year-round cover for birds and insects. Clematis and certain varieties of rose are also excellent climbers for wildlife.

4. Build an insect hotel

Leave piles of rocks, twigs and rotting wood in your garden. These will create shelter for all sorts of important insects, such as beetles and spiders.





5. Create a pond

A pond is a real boost for wildlife. It doesn't have to be huge. You can use a buried bucket or trough. If you do want a big pond, make sure there are stones or branches to help—wildlife get in and out. Ponds are best filled with unchlorinated rainwater from a water butt. Waterlilies will help prevent it from becoming stagnant. Avoid locating it in full sun or full shade.

6. Compost

A compost heap is a win-win. Making and using your own compost will naturally enrich your soil. It will also provide a habitat for worms, woodlice and many other insects, including frogs and slow worms. To avoid attracting rats, only add raw, not cooked food.

7. Leave a gap in your fence

Don't lock out hedgehogs and frogs. Make sure your garden fences have some gaps at the bottom. This will allow wildlife to move through from plot-to-plot. It will also help link different habitats together.

8. Grow flowers

Flowers look beautiful and bring colour and scent into your garden. They also provide food for many insects. Grow as many varieties as possible to ensure colour from spring through to autumn. Go for native species, if possible.

9. Have a break from weeding

Learn to relax about weeds. Plants such as nettles, daisies and buttercups are important sources of food for many insects, including butterflies and moths. They flower for a long time, whatever the weather and so provide food when other sources might be absent.
